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Dear Centerville ISD Parents/Guardians:

The Texas Education Agency (TEA) requires school districts to notify parents of the requirements of the Public Education Grant (PEG) Program authorized under Texas Education Code, Chapter 29, Subchapter G, §§29.201 - 29.205. Under PEG, TEA identifies campuses at which 50 percent or less of the students passed the TAKS/STAAR in any two of the preceding three years or were rated Academically Unacceptable in 2010 or rated Improvement Required in 2013 under the state accountability system. Centerville High School was rated Improvement Required in 2012-2013 as was Centerville Elementary in 2013-2014 based on the student improvement criteria. In 2013-2014, Centerville High School came out of the Improvement Required Rating and was rated with the Met Standard rating. No new state accountability ratings were issued in 2012. Due to changing to the new STAAR test, 2012-2013, was the first year a rating was given for the STAAR testing. Over 892 schools in Texas made the PEG list under the new standards.

Although Centerville High School did Meet Standard last year, we are still required to send this letter based on the previous year rating of 2012-2013. We put many new systems in place last year to improve and are continuing those systems this school year to continue to Meet Standard. We need your continued support and encouragement to prevent returning to an Improvement Required standard.

As the parent or guardian of a student attending a campus identified for school improvement status, you have the option to request a transfer of your child to another School District not on the PEG list for the 2014-2015 school year. If you apply for transfer to a neighboring school district, the district chosen is entitled to accept or reject the application for the student to attend school in that district, but may not use criteria that discriminate on the basis of a student's race, ethnicity, academic achievement, athletic abilities, language proficiency, sex or socioeconomic status. If the application is accepted, the school district chosen may not charge the student tuition. The home school district does not have to pay for transportation charges to and from school.
